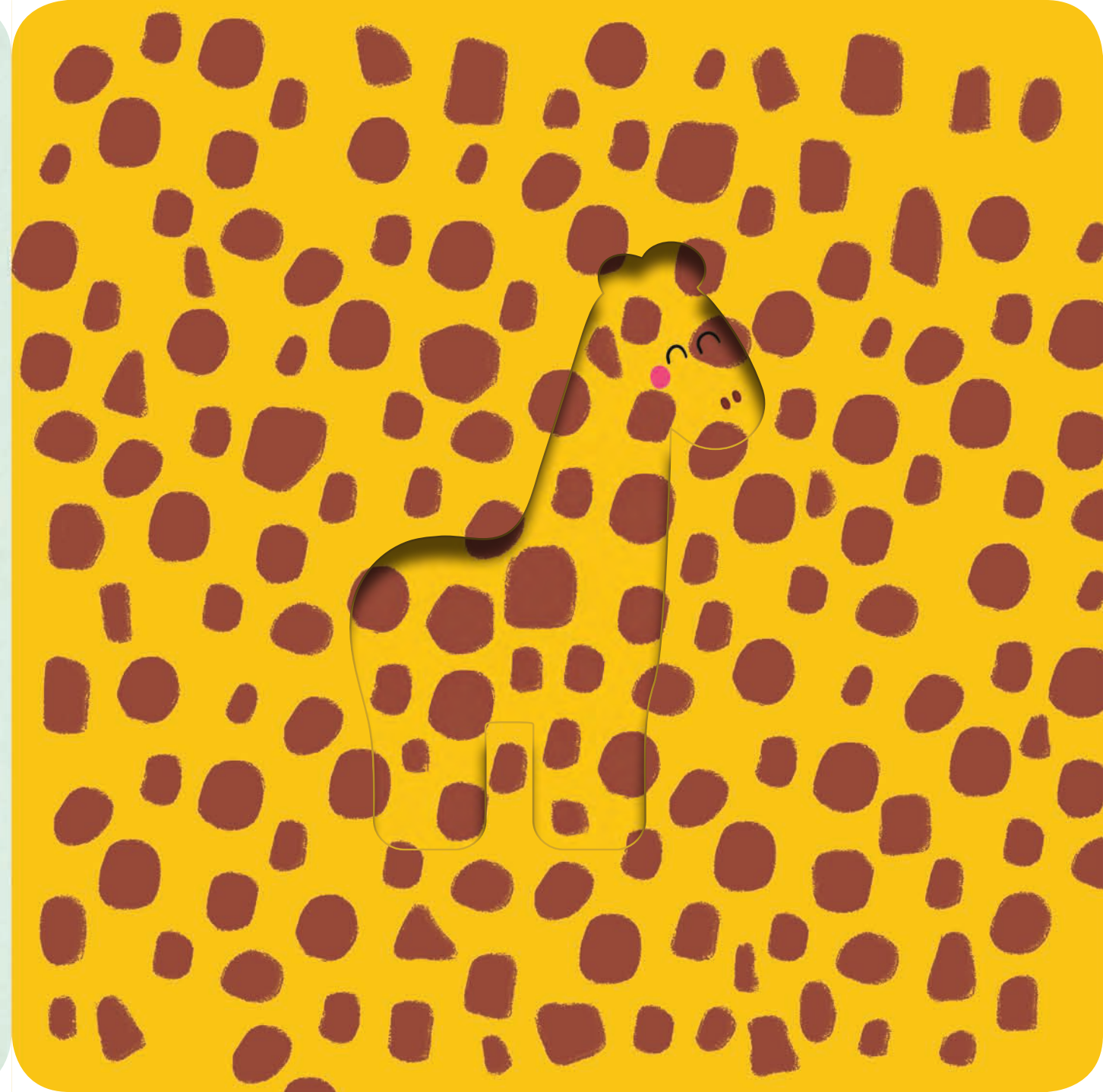


Which disguise


