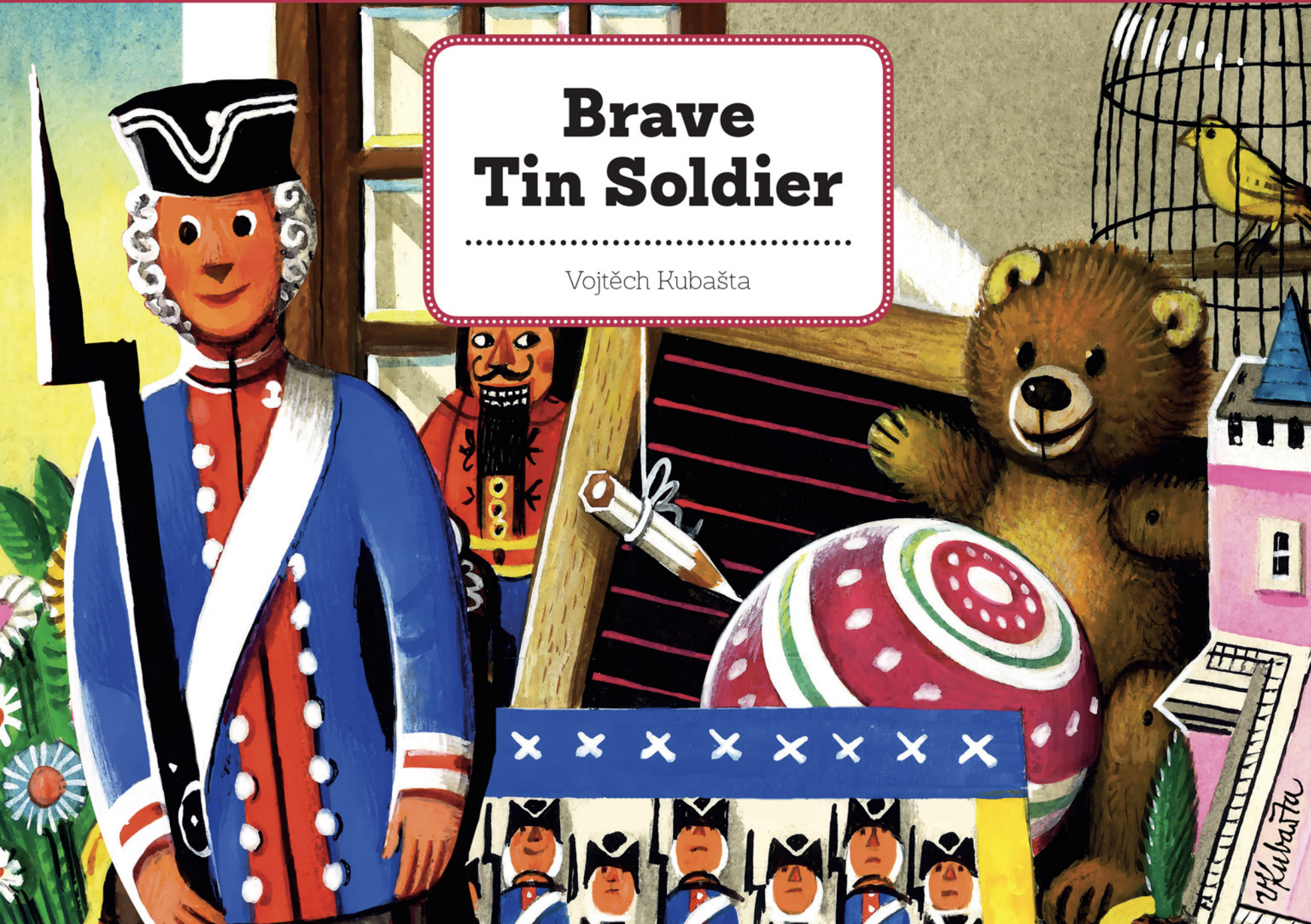




Brave Tin Soldier
