A Window into History

Well, and as Just Nuisance became a sailor, he could travel with us by train when we wanted to go out in the evenings. As members of the Royal Navy, we travelled for free. When Just Nuisance was still an ordinary dog, the conductors would get mad at him, sayin' he's a fare dodger and kickin' him out of the carriage, and the headquarters had to pay a fine for him. But when he became a sailor, there was no problem at all. If Just Nuisance hadn't experienced ill health later on, he could have joined the officer's rank. That's how great he was. Credit where credit's due."
