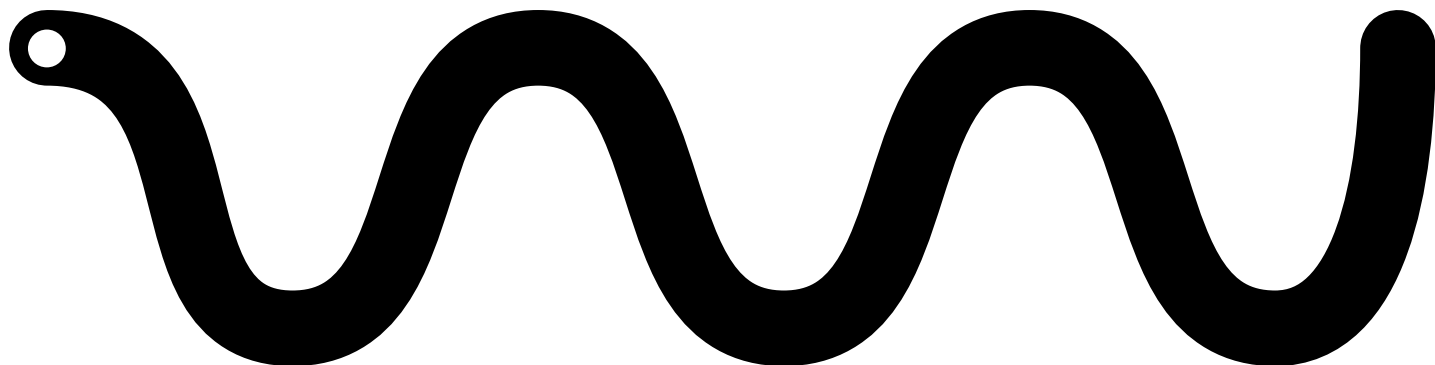

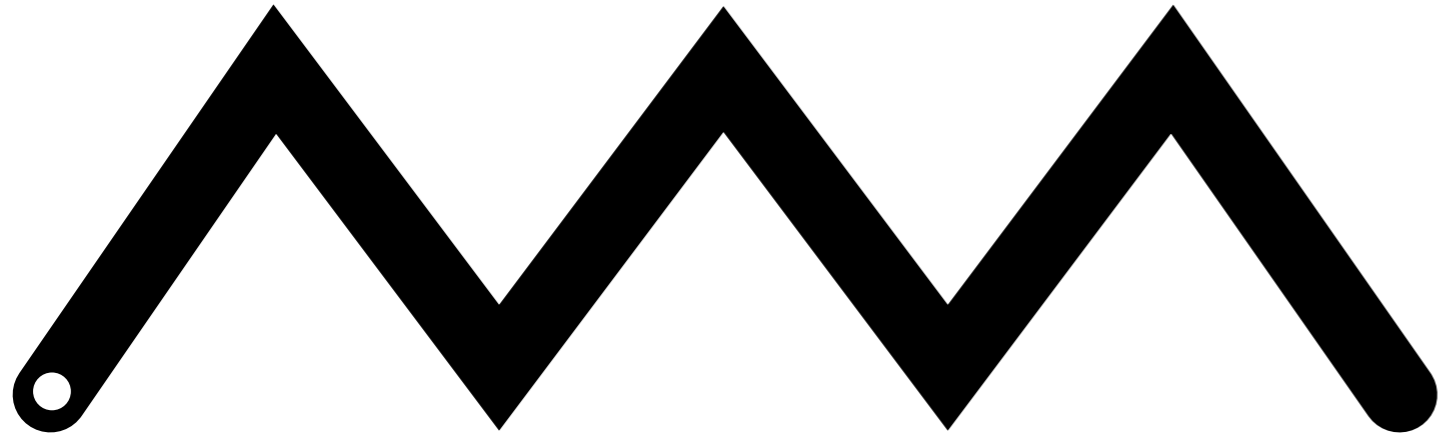

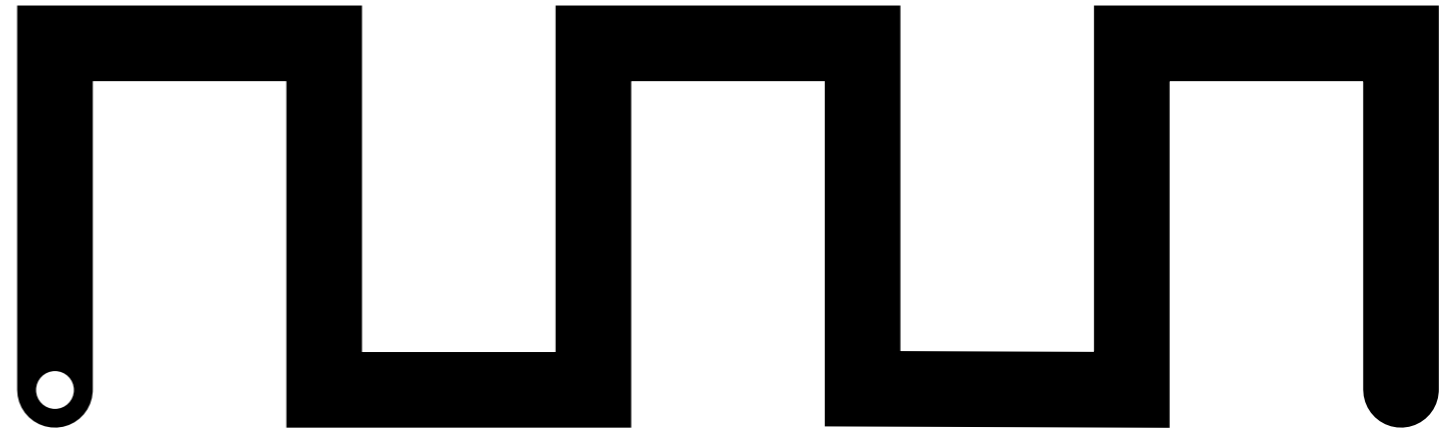
**RAINWORMS**



**Three weeks later, once there's no room left in the cocoon, she pokes her little head out. She wiggles and explores, and sometimes she bumps into things.**

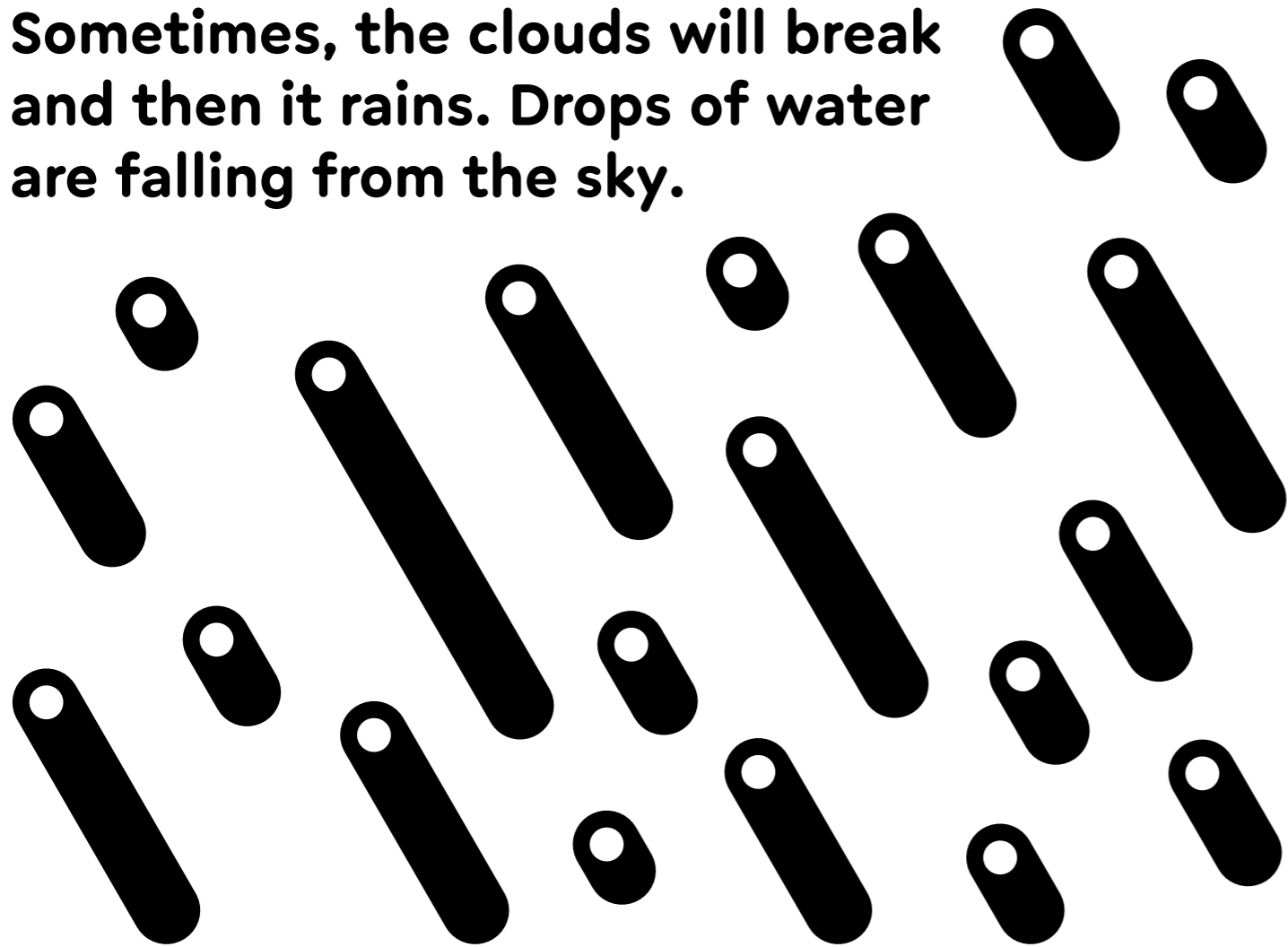


**She tries to avoid rocks and pieces of wood. She can handle any obstacle standing in her way.**

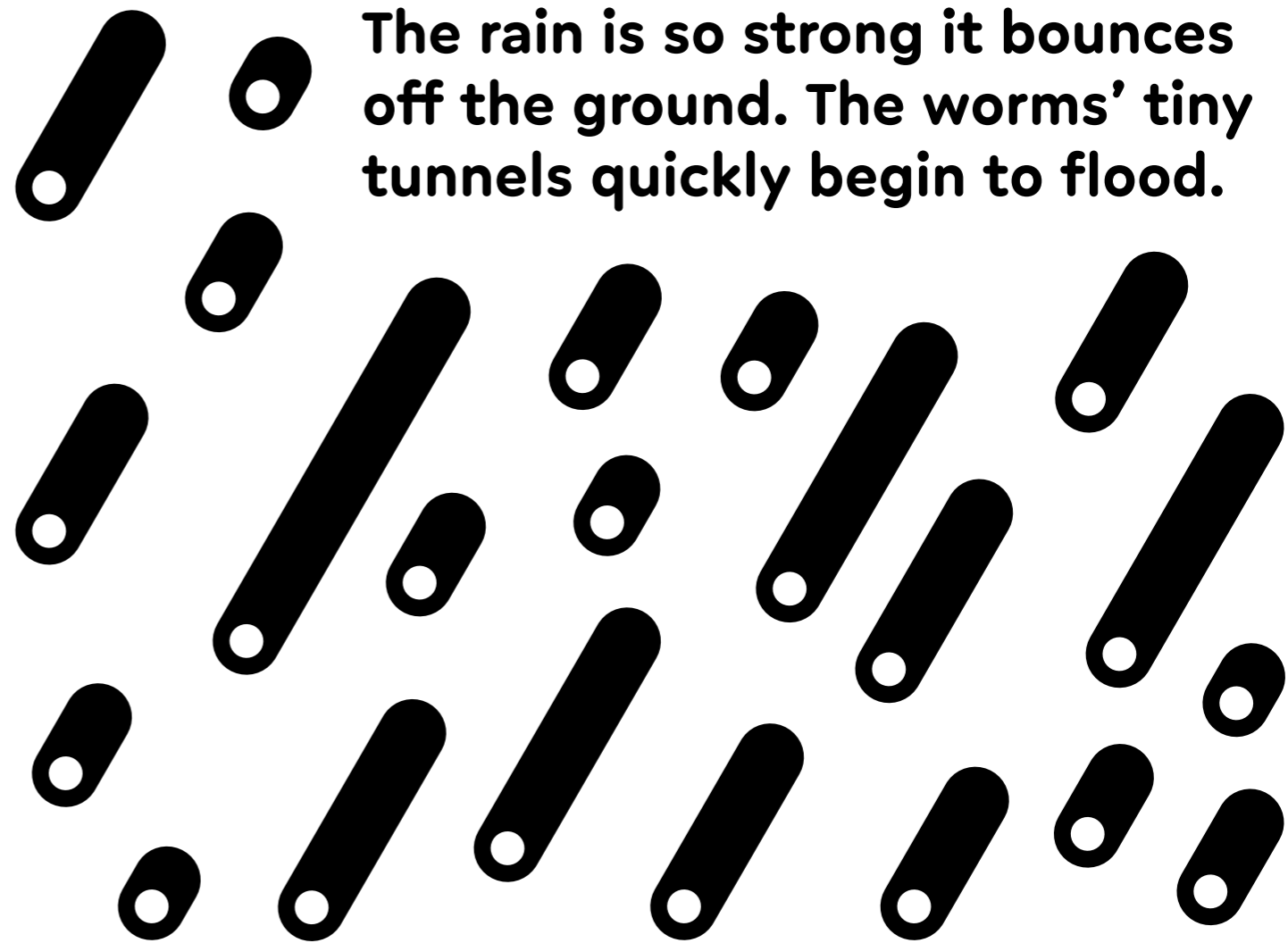




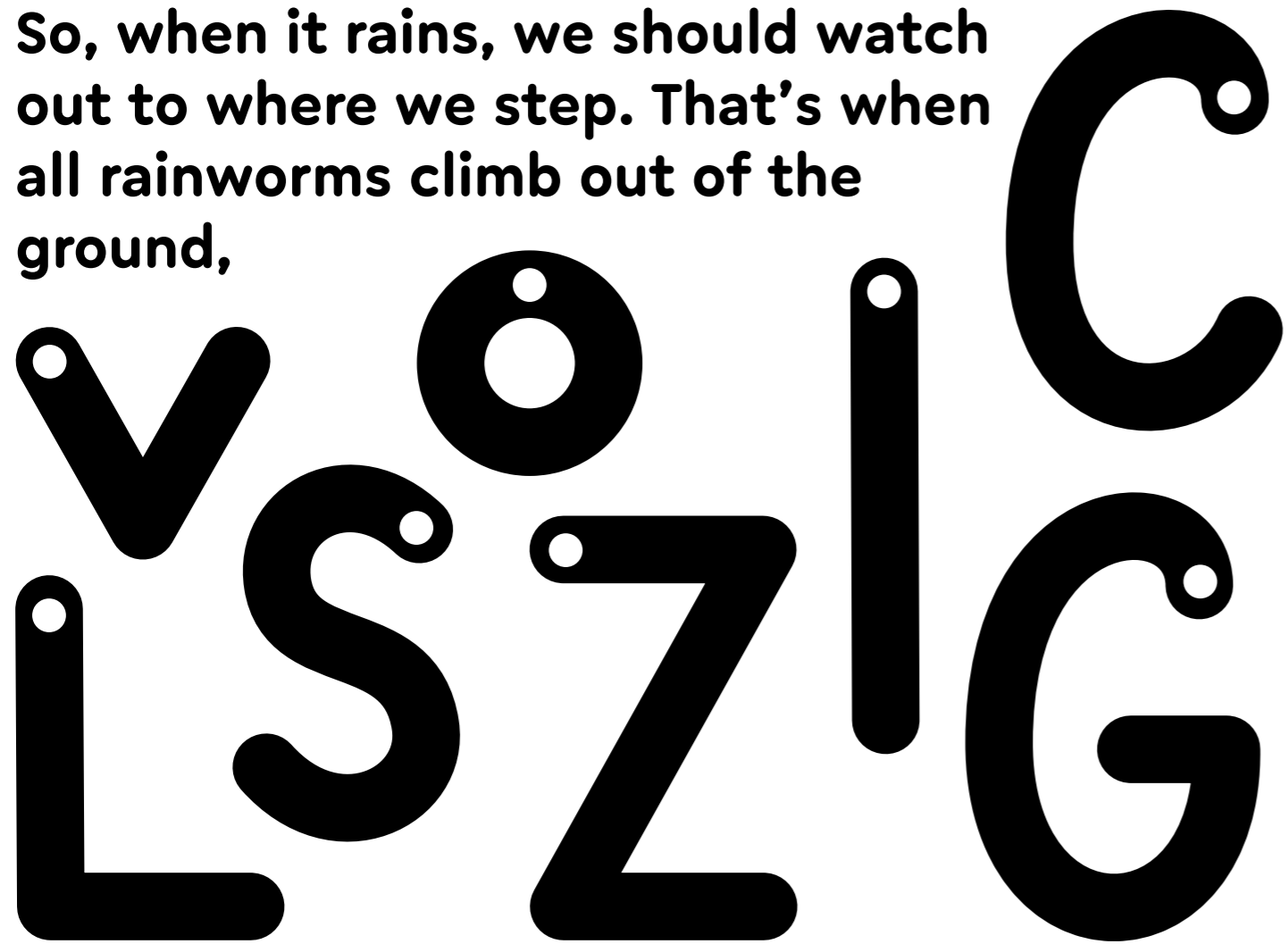
**Sometimes, the clouds will break and then it rains. Drops of water are falling from the sky.**



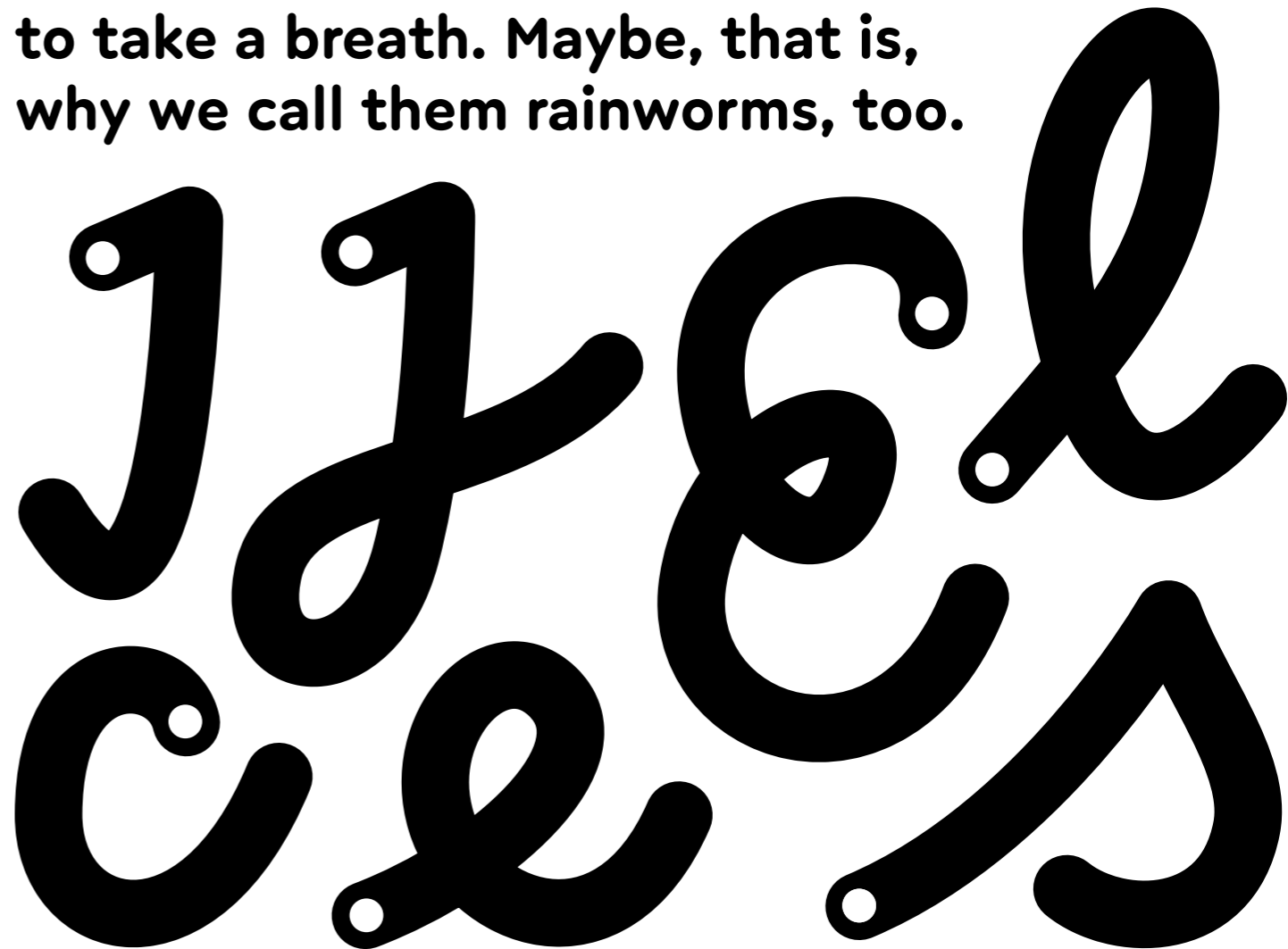
**The rain is so strong it bounces off the ground. The worms' tiny tunnels quickly begin to flood.**
