
SPARROWS HAVE HIGH VOICES.

DWELLINGS.






SOMETIMES,

SPARROWS ARE CALLED SPARROWS IN ENGLISH.






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"Deal!" Gus sadly nodded, although he was not looking forward to the concert at all. He rested his head on the pillow and his eyes wandered around the room.



Then his gaze fell to the old photo on the wall and he remembered something which he had long since forgotten.








