Presents are placed under the tree. They exchange small gifts, mainly handmade.

Reindeer and whale meat, "auks" (laridae seabirds), rice pudding with almonds topped with sour cherry juice, "muktuk" (whale skin), and "kiviak" (a dish of meat, fat, blood, herbs, and berries).

On Christmas Eve, there's a tradition that the men cater to the women, serving them food and coffee. After the Christmas feast, games are played.

RUSSIA THE NEW YEAR YOLKA

Roast goose cooked in sour cream sauce, stuffed with prunes and red cabbage, veal, fish in a savory jelly called aspic, varenyky (dumplings made by wrapping unleavened dough filled with potato, cheese, and mushrooms), rice, kutia (a grain dish with sweet gravy and honey, nuts, poppy seeds, or raisins), and vzvar (a dried fruit dessert).
