



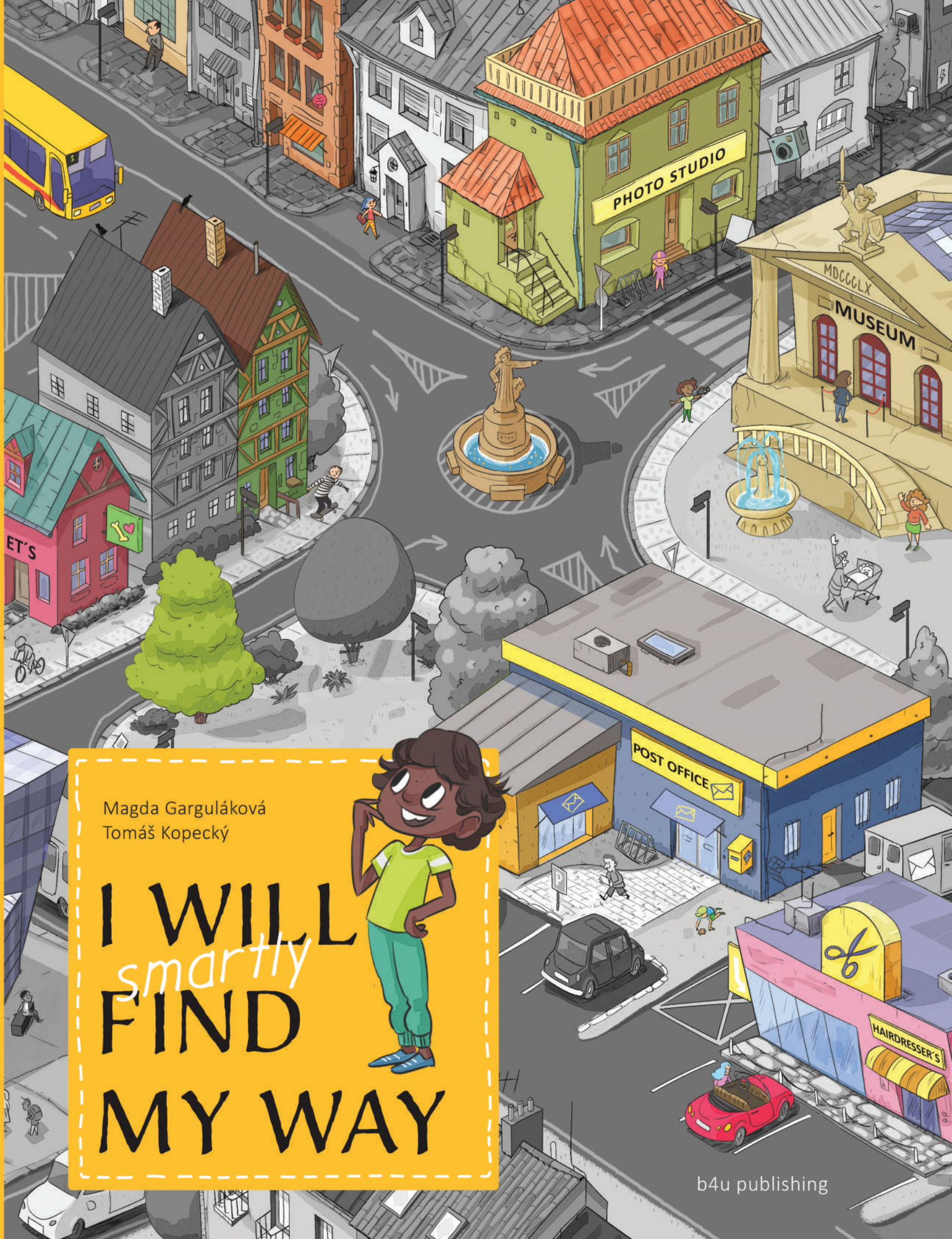

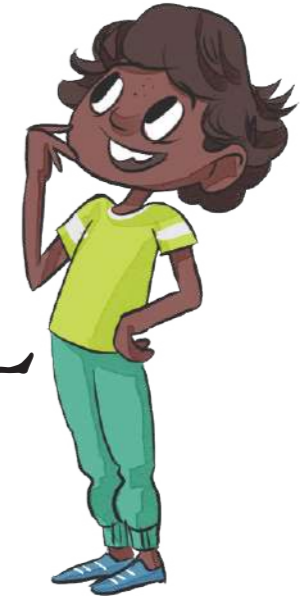

A HISTORY OF POSTAL DELIVERIES

People have exchanged notes, messages and greetings since time immemorial. Long ago, fast messengers ran with them – a tiring, tedious process. Later, they were brought by postmen on horseback or by stagecoach. Today, they are delivered using fast cars, trains, aeroplanes and bicycles. Most of today's mail travels through the air – we write many more emails than letters.



POST BOX

We drop letters, postcards, greeting cards and official letters into a post box, where they wait to be collected and taken where they need to be. All we have to do is stick on a stamp – and, of course, write the address, so that the postman or -woman knows where to deliver them. Post boxes vary in appearance from country to country.



THE FIRST STAMP

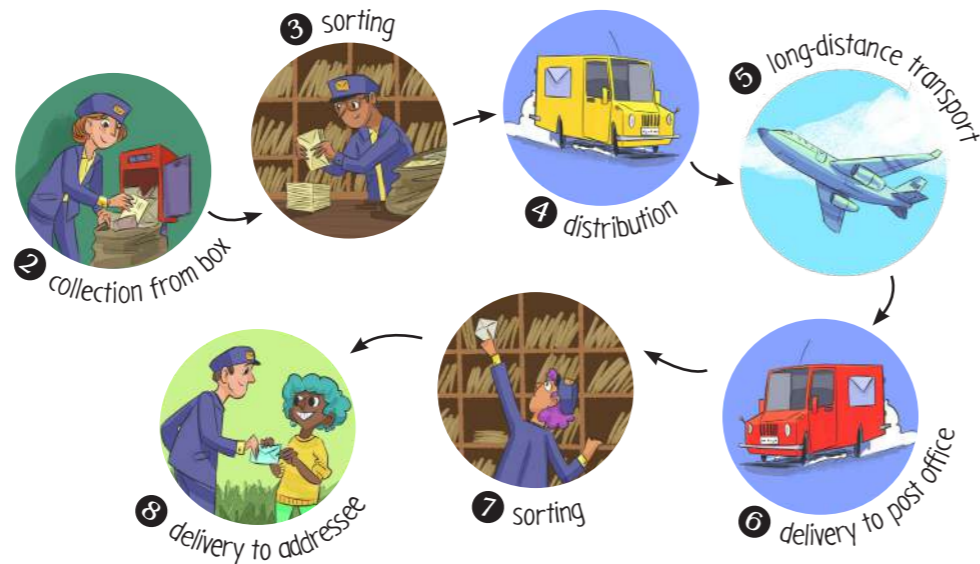

1 letter for posting – drop it to the post box

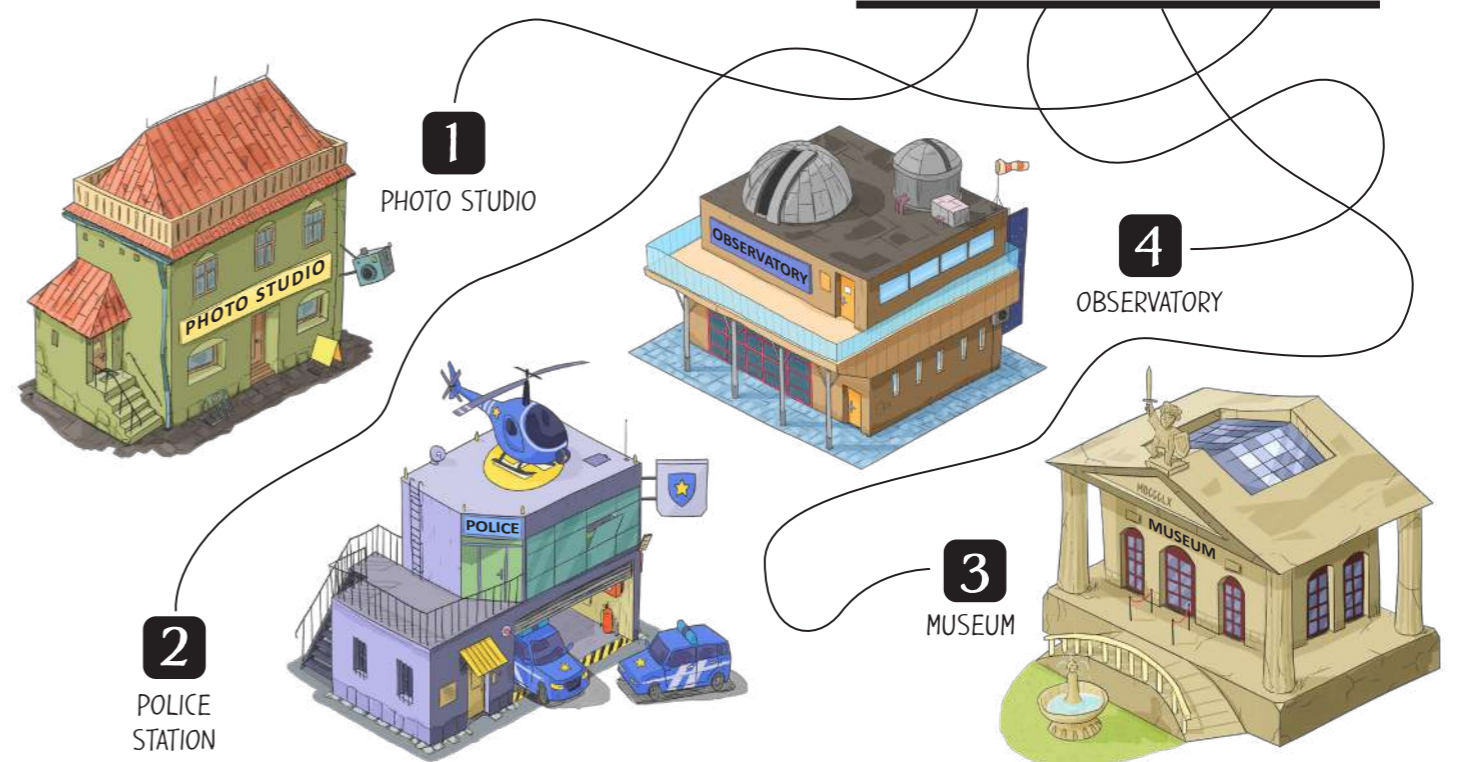
Before a letter reaches its addressee, it must pass through the hands of a sorter, a driver or pilot, and a deliveryman or deliverywoman.

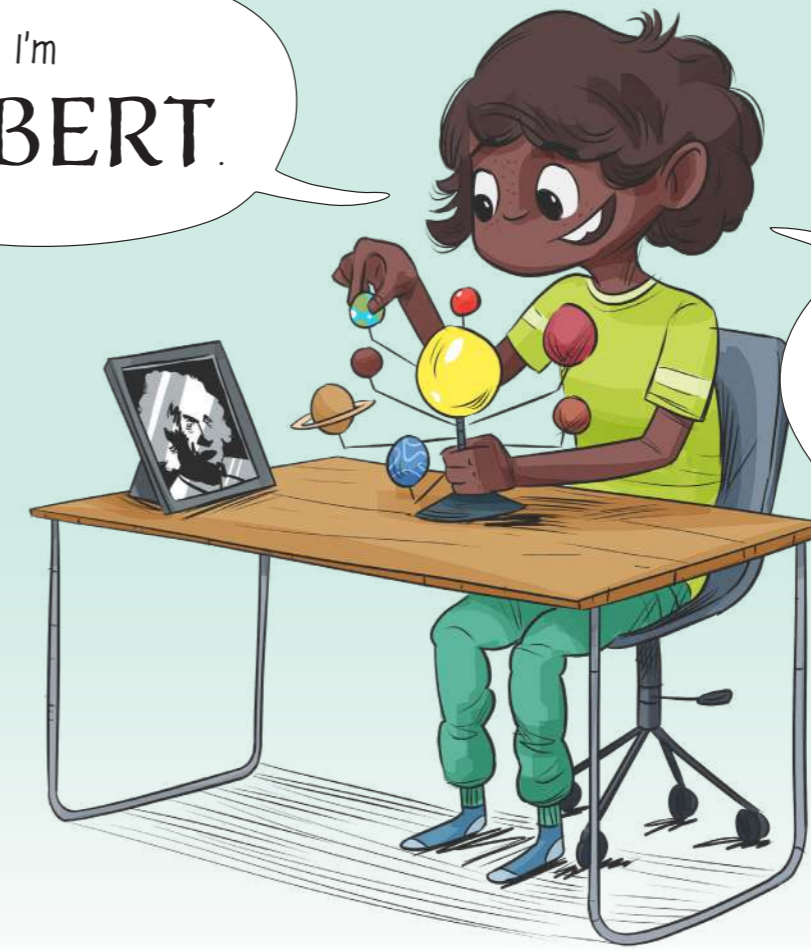

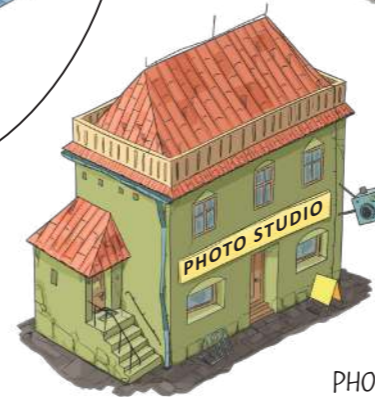

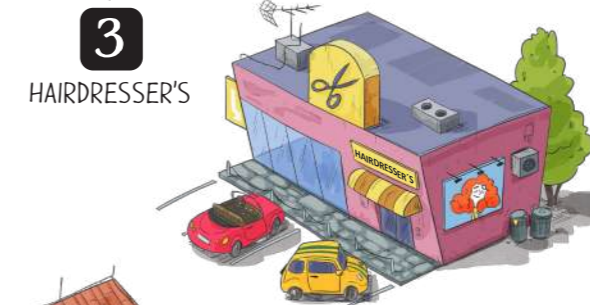
