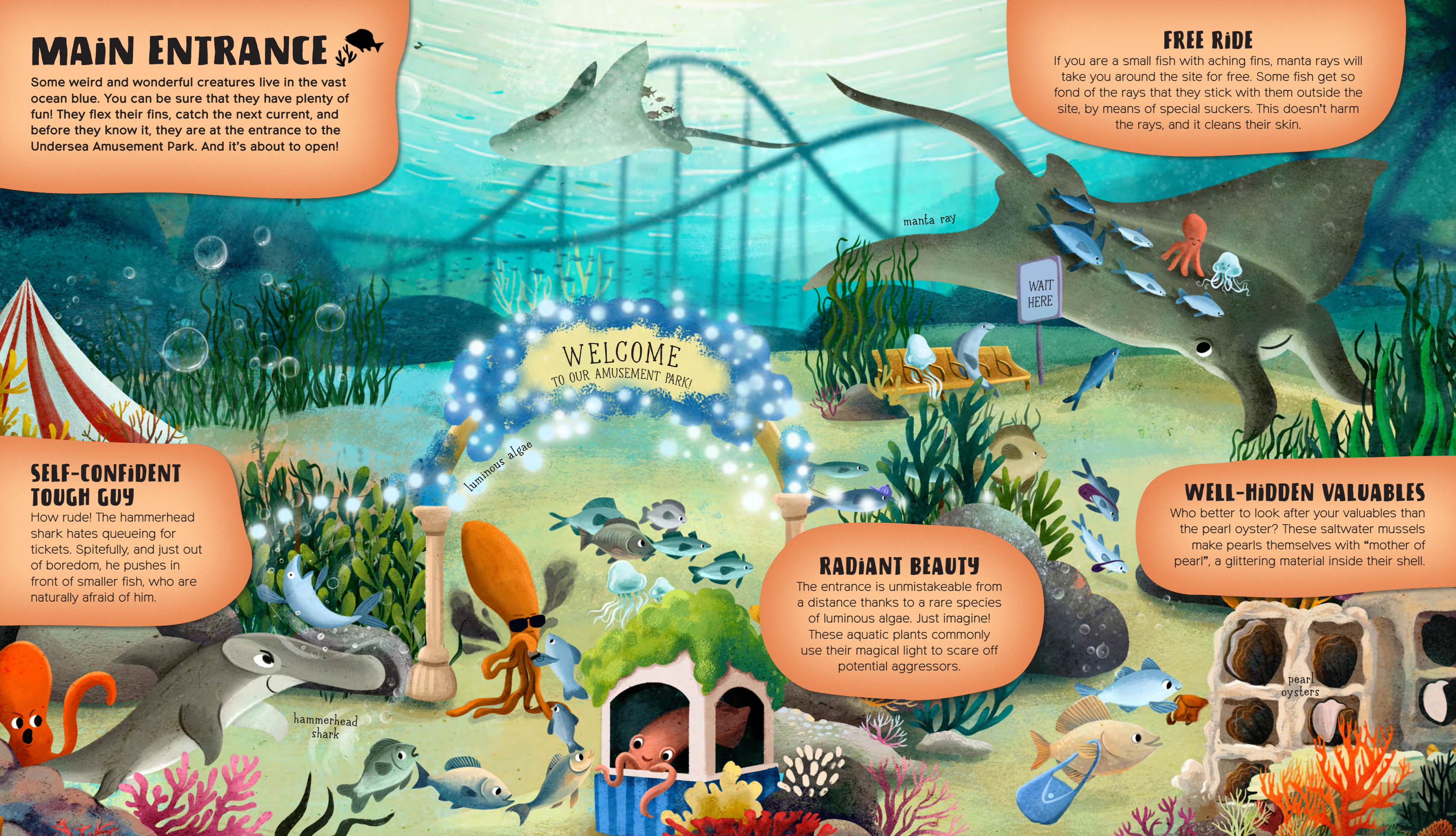
RADIANT BEAUTY

It's not easy for small fish to race in dense red and brown algae and seaweed, in which a tail can easily get stuck. Aim true and try not to get caught up!

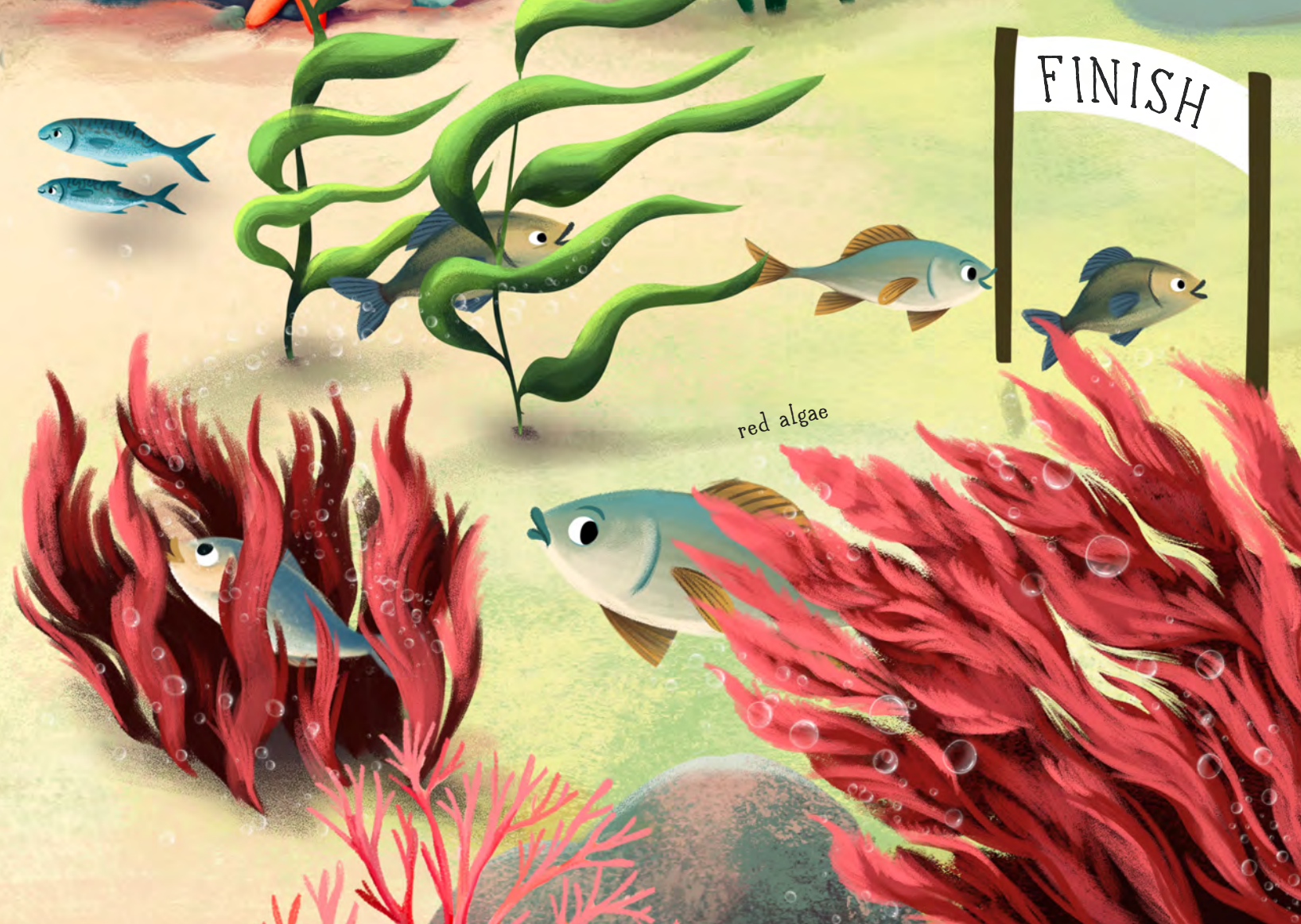
THROWING BLIND
