



## AMAZING ATMOSPHERE

Earth is wrapped in a layer of gases called the atmosphere. It's like an invisible shield—it keeps us safe, warm, and helps us breathe. Now add the right stickers to each layer!

#### **EXOSPHERE**

The edge of space. This topmost layer slowly fades into outer space. It's where many satellites orbit.

#### **THERMOSPHERE**

Though it feels freezing to us, this layer is super-hot, thanks to the Sun's energy. It's where glowing lights called auroras dance around.

#### **MESOSPHERE**

Brr, it's so cold here! This is where meteors—tiny bits of cosmic dust—burn up as "shooting stars."

#### **STRATOSPHERE**

Military and spy planes soar in this calm, almost cloudless layer. It's also home to the ozone layer, which protects us from harmful ultraviolet rays.

#### TROPOSPHERE

This is where we live. It has all the weather, clouds, and water vapor—and all life. Planes and helicopters fly here too.

Too many greenhouse gases make Earth too hot. Look at the circled items—each adds to the problem.

Greenhouse gases help keep Earth warm—without them, it would be super cold! Some are natural, but others come from things people do.

## IN THE SKY

High, wispy clouds made of tiny ice crystals.




Did you know that the sky is full of breathtaking—and sometimes tricky—phenomena? Read the short descriptions in the boxes and match each with the correct sticker.
