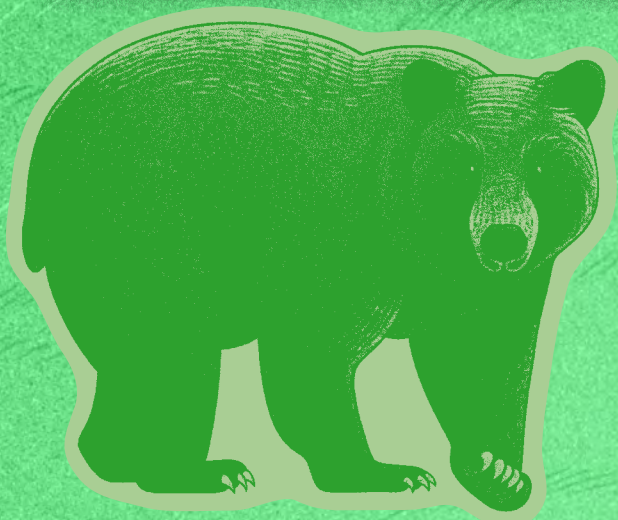

Despite its size, it can run surprisingly fast.



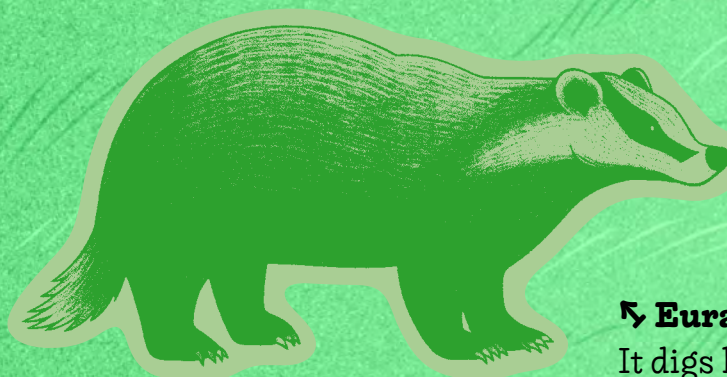
← Eurasian lynx

This sprinter can run up to 34 miles per hour and even zigzag to escape predators!



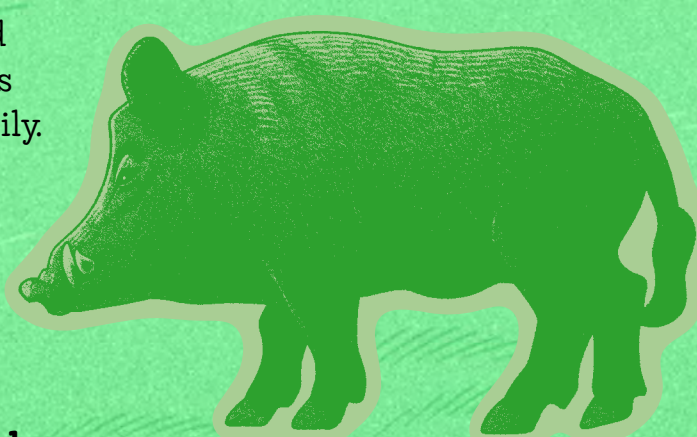
↑ Edible frog

It digs large underground homes with many tunnels and chambers for its family.



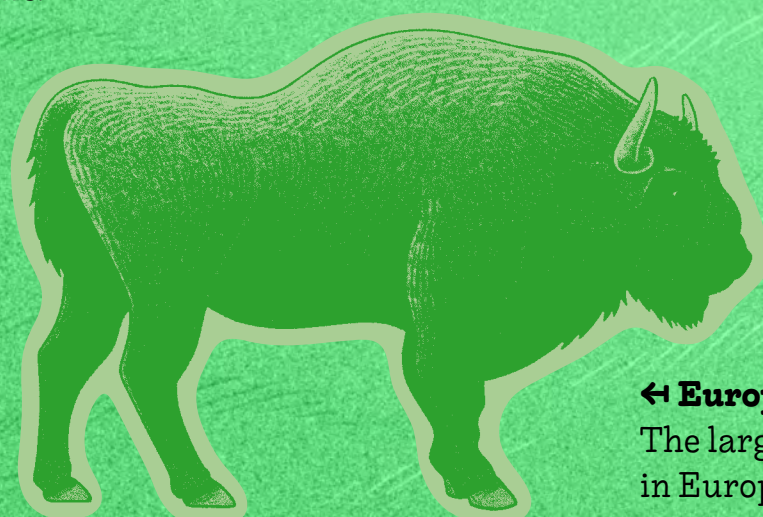
→ Fire salamander

This small, red-breasted bird sings beautifully and feeds on insects and seeds.



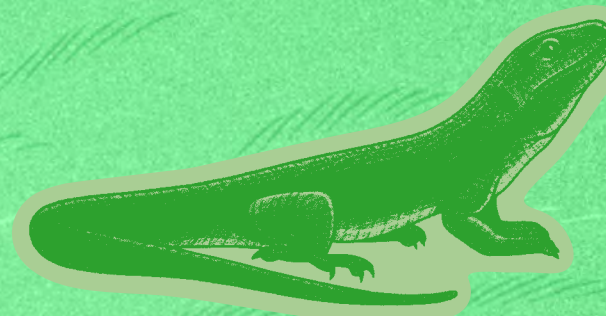
← European bison

It can turn its head almost all the way around.



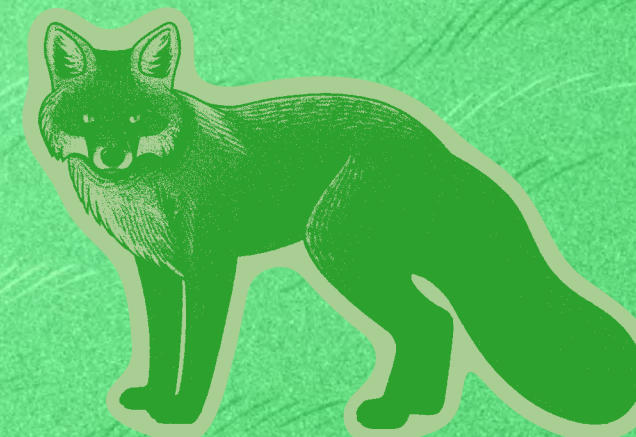
→ Eurasian beaver

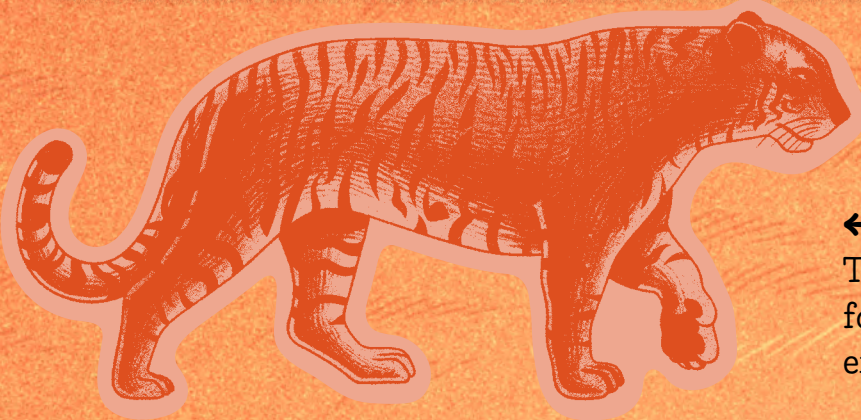


Pilchard

This large bird with a huge beak feeds on fruit and lives in large trees.

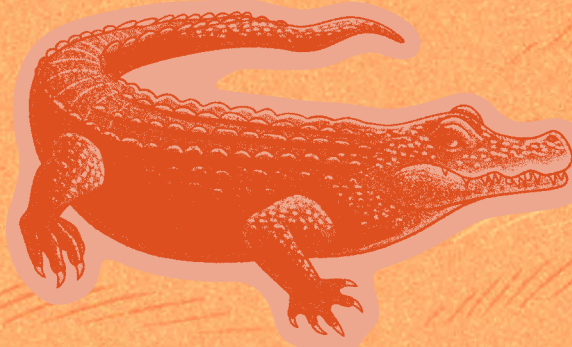


↑ **Indian star tortoise**

→ **Malayan tapir**
Its black-and-white coloring helps it blend into the shadows of the jungle.



↗ **Snow leopard**
A beautiful mountain predator, with only a few thousand left in the wild.



↓ **Komodo dragon**
It ambushes its prey and uses a single bite to bring it down.

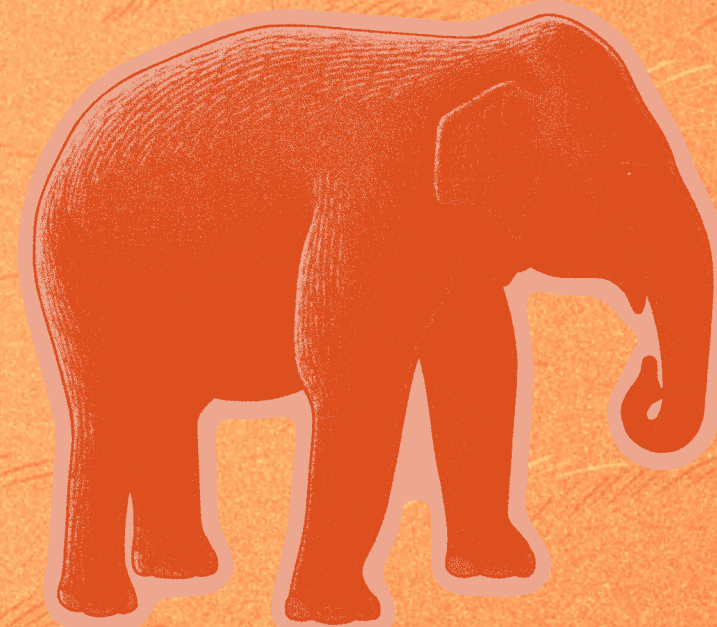
↑ **Chinese alligator**
A rare alligator that even hibernates during the colder months.



↑ **Wild yak**
A powerful animal that can grow very large and strong.



↑ **King cobra**
This venomous snake can spread the skin on its neck to scare off enemies.



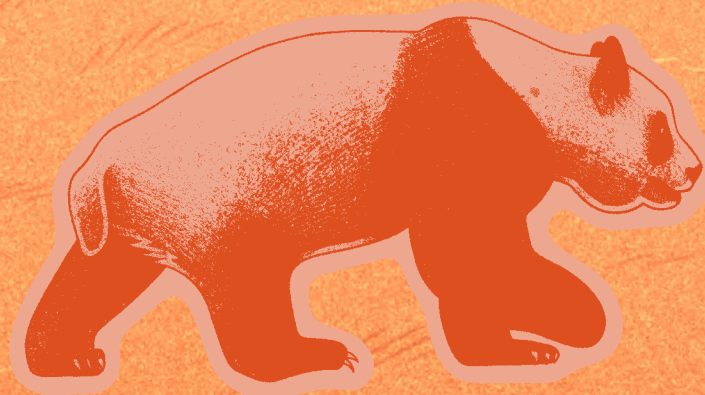
← **Asian elephant**
It can lift very heavy objects using its strong trunk.



→ **Indian giant flying squirrel**
This bushy-tailed squirrel glides from tree to tree and feeds on fruit and nuts.



→ **Orangutan**
Critically endangered because of rainforest loss, with only a small number remaining.



↑ **Giant panda**
This big eater can munch through up to about 26 pounds of bamboo every day.

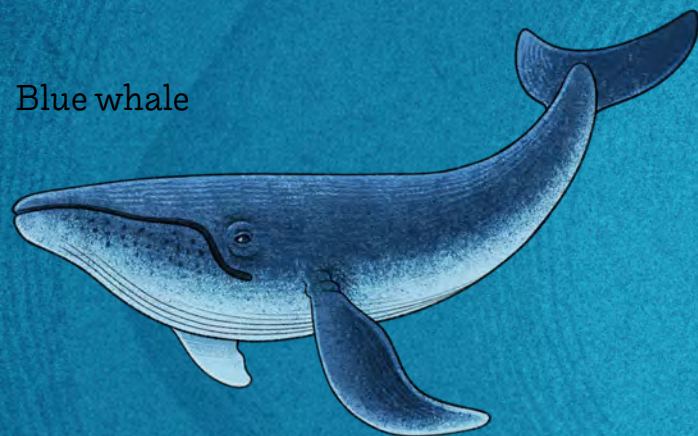


→ **Japanese macaque**
These monkeys live in snowy mountains and love to warm up in hot springs.

← **Southern cassowary**
A southern cassowary wears a helmet-like casque on its head.



↑ **Tasmanian devil**
Known for its powerful bite and loud, fierce sounds.



↑ **Sugar glider**
It can glide through the air as far as a basketball court is long.



↑ **Common wombat**
Famous for its unusual cube-shaped droppings.



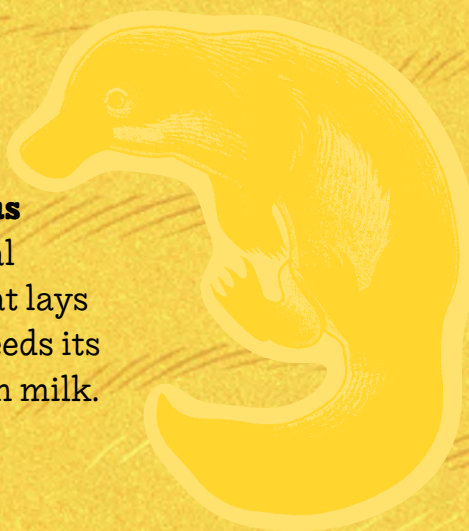
← **Koala**
A cuddly-looking animal that sleeps most of the day.



← **Great gray kangaroo**
It can leap great distances in a single jump.



↑ **Superb lyrebird**
This bird mimics sounds and dances as part of its courtship display.



→ **Platypus**
An unusual animal that lays eggs but feeds its young with milk.



→ **Australian king parrot**
This bright-colored parrot feeds on fruit, flies in forests and likes tall trees.



← **Saltwater crocodile**
A large predator that can travel far out into the ocean.



↑ **Eastern quoll**
It can climb with ease and even move down trees headfirst.

↓ **Green tree python**
This bright-colored snake camouflages itself in foliage and hunts birds and mammals.



← **Emu**
A fast-running bird that cannot fly.



↗ **Australian pelican**
This large bird uses its huge beak pouch like a fishing net to catch fish.



→ **Tammar wallaby**
Like its kangaroo relative, this smaller creature is herbivorous and has a pouch.

↓ **Dingo**
Wild dogs that arrived in Australia thousands of years ago.



← **Frilled dragon**
A lizard with a leathery neck frill that spreads wide to scare off enemies.

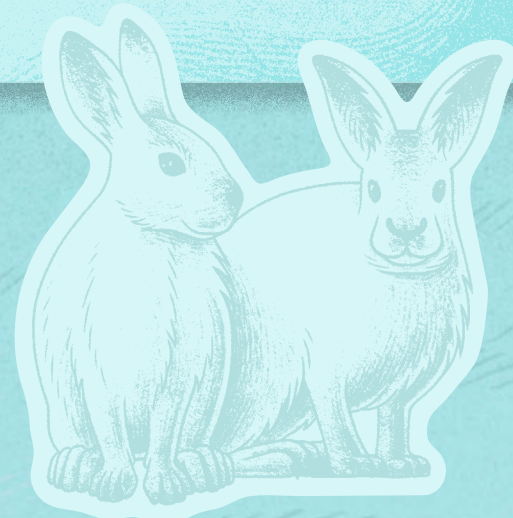
→ **Short-beaked echidna**
This spiny mammal uses its long, sticky tongue to slurp up ants and termites.



Polar regions

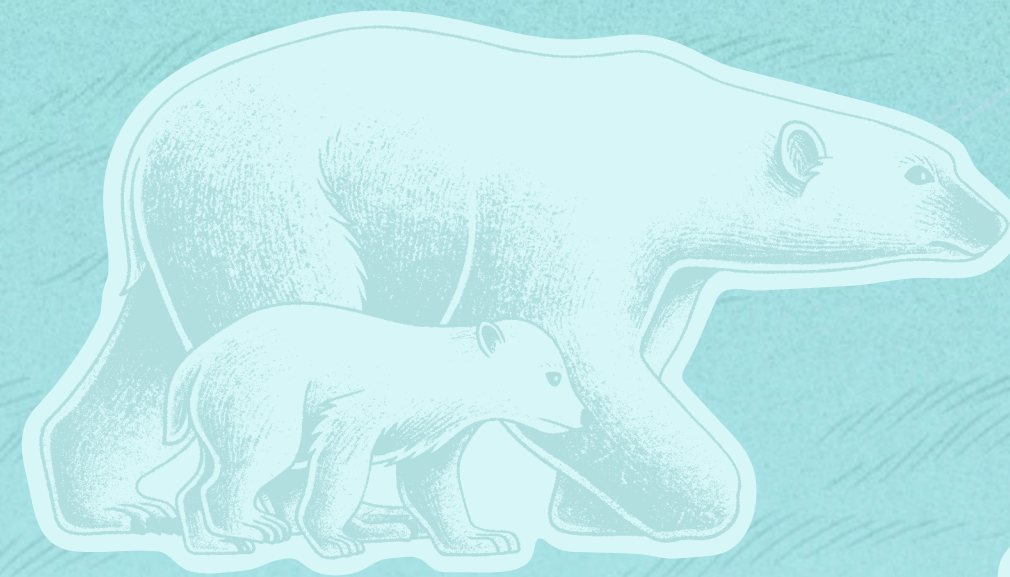
↗ Walrus

A huge animal with long tusks and a thick body.



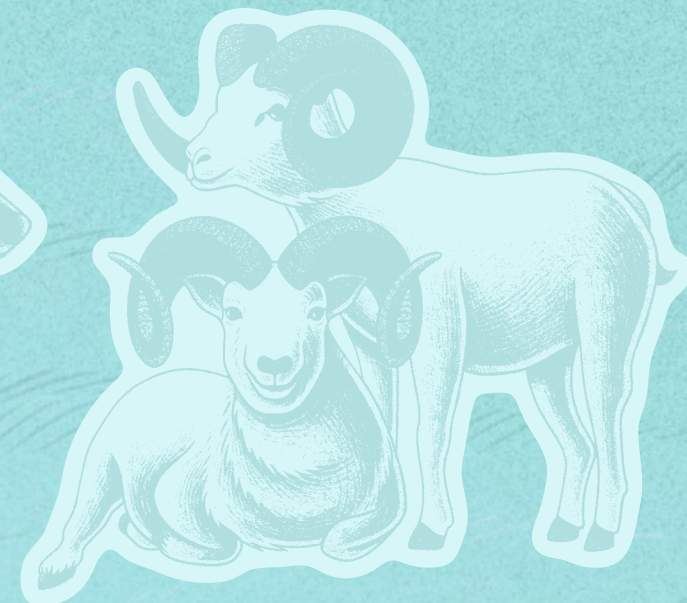
↑ Arctic hare

A powerful hunter that lives in the icy north.

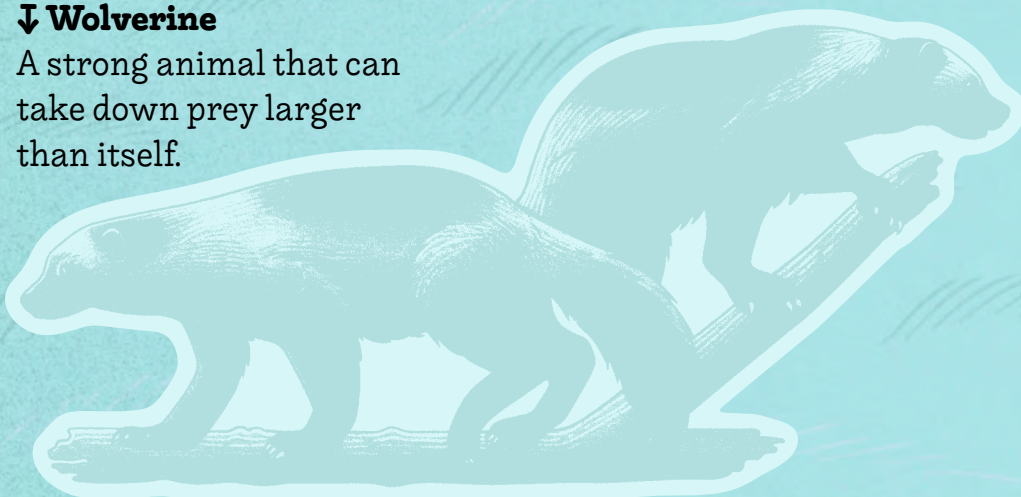


↑ Dall sheep

A deer that people have raised for food, milk, and work.



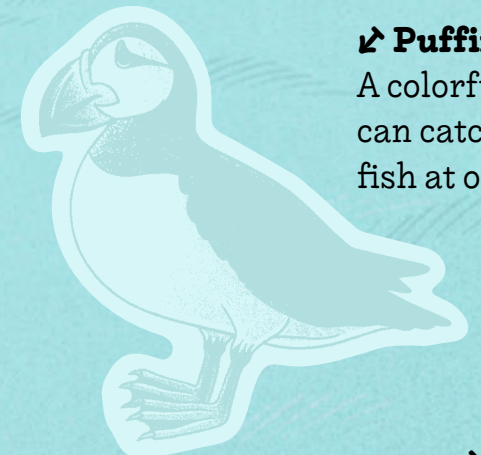
← Snowy owl

A colorful bird that can catch several fish at once.



↗ Arctic tern

This small bird travels farther than any other animal during its yearly migration.



← Arctic fox

This shaggy fox wraps its fluffy tail around its body like a blanket to stay warm.



↗ Ribbon seal

It can dive deep underwater and stay there for a long time.



↑ Ringed seal

This small spotted seal loves ice. It feeds on fish and squid.



← Sea otter

A playful animal that uses tools to open shellfish.

↗ Muskox

A muskox uses its curved horns to defend itself from predators.



↗ Bearded seal

Its thick layer of fat helps protect it from the cold.
